We are looking for dynamic creative people who are passionate about teaching, sailing and creating inclusive communities. Interns will participate in the day-to-day operations of the sailing vessels. Interns will receive Sea Time on either of COTS vessels, Seaward (65 gross tons) or Matthew Turner (98 gross tons).

Who we are: Call of the Sea (<https://callofthesea.org>) is an educational sailing non-profit that provides inclusive and equitable access to the waters of San Francisco Bay and the coast of California. Call of the Sea conducts numerous education programs and public sails including overnight, day, and weeklong trips aboard our two sailing ships. Call of the Sea is seeking to hire and support motivated interns who share backgrounds and experience with the diverse communities we serve.

Qualifications:

- Minimum age of 18.
- Strong enthusiasm for community building, cross-cultural education, and supporting inclusive and equitable programming with diverse populations.
- Ability and eagerness to live and work in a tight-knit community in close quarters.
- A passion for learning, youth development, education, and sail training.
- Able to commit to a summer contract from June 16th - August 10th.

No previous sailing or maritime experience necessary.

- Aid in sailing and maintaining the ships.
- Aid in educational programs onboard and ashore.
- Share your unique experiences, talents, and skills.
